



CURRICULUM VITAE

Max Fabiani

1865 born in Kobjlj near Štanjel (San Daniele sul Carso)

1883 school-graduation examination at the Realschule in Ljubljana/Laibach

1883–1885 study of architecture at the Technische Hochschule in Vienna

1885 first state examination

1885/1886 military service

1886–1889 second phase of the study of architecture at the Technische Hochschule in Vienna

1890–1892 assistant at the Chair of Architecture of the Technische Hochschule in Graz under Professor Richard Edl. von Löwe

1892 degree, with the title “diploma architect”

1892/93 a travel scholarship from the Ghega Foundation of the Austrian Association of Engineers and Architects (ÖIAV) for the TH Vienna enables him to undertake study trips to Greece, Asia Minor, Italy, Germany, France, Belgium and England

1894 Fabiani organises an exhibition of his travel sketches in the ÖIAV

1896–1910 worked in the studio of Otto Wagner

1896–1910 assistant at the Chair for Composition at the Technische Hochschule in Vienna under Professor Karl König

1896–1917 own studio in Vienna

1902 doctorate in technical sciences at the Technische Hochschule in Vienna, Fabiani was the first Viennese architect with a doctorate

1904–1907 chairman of the competition commission of the ÖIAV

1910–1917 associate Professor for Ornament and Interior Decoration at the Technische Hochschule in Vienna

1914 called up for military service

1917 named Professor for Architectural Composition (according to the Architects Lexicon a professorship at the TH, which Fabiani, however, did not take up)

1917–1922 head of the office for reconstruction in Görz (Gorizia, Gorica)

1918–1962 own studio in Görz

1924–1927 lectures in art history at the Lyzeum Viktor Emanuel III in Görz

1924–1945 Secretary of the Chamber of Engineers and Architects in Görz

1925–1958 member of the Italian commission for church art

1927–1931 member of the state board of directors of the Chamber of Engineers and Architects in Rome

1935–1945 Mayor of Štanjel/San Daniele sul Carso

1938–1962 honorary inspector for monument conservation for the Province of Görz



1947 finally moved his place of residence to Görz

1952 the Technische Hochschule in Vienna awards him the Gold Doctoral Diploma in Technical Sciences
(at the same time as Plečnik)

1962 dies in Görz and is buried there

1984 in accordance with his wishes his mortal remains are laid to rest in the Fabiani family crypt in the
cemetery of St. Gregory in Kobdilj
